

2011 Iowa State University Block and Bridle Club Lamb Sale

Rules and Regulations

- Entry Fees for all entries must accompany the respective entry form. Entries postmarked or delivered to Block and Bridle Club %Lamb Sale Committee in Ames, Iowa by **March 21st, 2011**- fees will be \$15.00 per entry animal. Entries postmarked or delivered to the address listed above after March 21st, 2011 (including day of sale)-\$20.00 per entry animal. All entry fees are non-refundable. Entry fees may be paid by cash or check (Make Checks Payable to ISU Block and Bridle Club).
- All lamb entries may arrive and check-in starting at 3:00pm (**NO EARLIER**) until 5:00pm on Saturday, April 1st, 2011. All lamb entries must be in place by 5:00pm on the day of the Sale. Viewing of Lambs will begin at 5:30pm with the sale to begin at 6:30pm.
- Checks will be mailed within Iowa State University's Treasury Department's time frame. A 15% Seller's Premium will be deducted from the total selling price after the sale. All sales will incur this premium.
- Lambs may be loaded right after the sale is complete and proper documentation of payment is presented.
- **No Clipping** the day of the event. All entries must be slick sheared above the knees and hocks prior to the sale.
- Entries are open to all lamb breeds and crossbreeds.
- **Limit 3 lambs per consignor.**
- Neither the Lamb Sale Committee Chairmen nor the Block and Bridle Club can or will assume any responsibility as to the authenticity of the pedigrees, bloodline, or DNA information provided by the consignor or otherwise. Any special guarantees or claims offered by the individual consignors is strictly between the consignor and buyer and will not be enforced by the sale management or committee.
- Block and Bridle Club Lamb Sale Committee and Chairmen reserve the right to refuse any entries for failure to comply with any rules of the sale.

Health Rules and Regulations

- All animals must be individually identified on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and originate from herds or areas not under quarantine. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for sheep will require clinical inspection by an accredited veterinarian within **14 days prior to date** of entry to exhibition grounds. The original health certificate must accompany shipment and the three (pink, yellow, white) copies of the original must be supplied for each animal.
NOTE: A separate health paper is required for each animal.
- The Consignee on your health paper should be ISU Block and Bridle Lamb Sale.
- All sexually intact sheep must be identified with an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin identification tag and this number must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. If not sexually intact (wethers) the sheep still must be identified with an individual alphanumeric identification. If you use tattoos instead of Scrapie tags:
 - ♣ Complete numbers from both ears (or complete tail or flank numbers) must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - ♣ Herd tattoo prefix must be registered with USDA by calling 1-866-USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824).
 - ♣ A statement must be included on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection indicating that the herd participates in the Scrapie program, and listing the official tattoo registered to the herd.
- Any evidence of club lamb fungus, ringworm, draining abscesses, foot rot, sore mouth, or any other contagious disease will eliminate the animal from the show.
